The **proposal** is your project overview and what you use to sell your idea to those who will approve it. It shows your beneficiary, unit leader and any representative of a unit committee, council, or *district*, that the test for **Meeting Eagle Scout Requirement 5, Choosing a Project** in the Eagle Project Workbook, can be met. The proposal details must be enough to provide a level of confidence for a council or district reviewer that your project qualifies and you can be successful with it.

When requesting *district* approval to begin your Eagle project, please use this outline to describe your project and include it, *as an attachment*, to the Eagle Project Proposal section of your workbook. *Please include a couple of pictures, drawings, maps, etc., to support your project proposal.*

**This, the workbook proposal section, and contacts page should be typed, not handwritten. Make sure to have all required signatures.*

1. Who is the beneficiary? How did you find them?
2. What did the beneficiary identify as a need or a problem for your project?
3. Why is this important to them and how will they or others benefit from your project?
4. How will you address the 3 main goals of an Eagle project: planning, development and leadership? Explain your project.
5. Include a rough estimate of total cost. Do some research on this...don't guess.

Note: Once your project has been approved, you pledge to do that project. If for any reason your project changes i.e., downsizes from the approved project, please contact Mr. Schwartz to reapprove.
